CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To memorialize Congress to ensure military and	1
overseas voters have the opportunity to vote	e and 2
register to vote.	3

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, The right to vote is a fundamental right; and 4
WHEREAS, Because of logistical, geographical, operational, 5
and environmental barriers, military and overseas voters are 6
burdened by many obstacles that negatively impact their right to 7
vote and register to vote; and 8

WHEREAS, Local, state, and federal government entities9involved with getting ballots to military and overseas voters must10work in conjunction to provide voter registration services and11balloting materials in a secure and expeditious manner; and12

WHEREAS, Improvements are needed to facilitate the ability of 13 military and overseas voters to register to vote and have their 14 ballots cast and counted, especially with respect to timing and 15 improvement of military and overseas absentee voter registration 16 and absentee balloting procedures; now therefore be it 17

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the 128th General Assembly 18

of the State of Ohio, urge the Congress of the United States to 19 support legislation that better facilitates the ability of 20 military and overseas voters to register to vote and have their 21 ballots counted by expanding the amount of time ballots are 22 available to military and overseas voters, providing for the 23 electronic transmission of blank ballots to military and overseas 24 voters, and ensuring that voting information and resources are 25 available at all overseas military installations and through the 26 development of online information portals; and be it further 27

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Senate transmit duly 28 authenticated copies of this resolution to the Speaker and Clerk 29 of the United States House of Representatives, the President Pro 30 Tempore and Secretary of the United States Senate, the members of 31 the Ohio Congressional delegation, and the news media of Ohio. 32
