CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To urge the United States Congress and the United	1
States Drug Enforcement Administration to change	2
federal laws, regulations, and policies to allow	3
patients to receive pain medication promptly when	4
transferred to a nursing home from a hospital.	5

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE SENATE CONCURRING):

WHEREAS, Ohio's nursing homes are focused both on serving6residents with long-term care needs and on rehabilitating patients7coming from hospitals following surgery or other treatment for8acute medical conditions before sending them home or to a lower9intensity setting; and10

WHEREAS, Patients coming from hospitals often arrive at a 11 nursing home with considerable pain; and 12

WHEREAS, Due to federal laws, regulations, and policies,13these patients often are prevented from receiving pain medication14promptly upon transfer to a nursing home and must wait to receive15adequate pain medication while physicians, nurses, and pharmacists16comply with federal requirements pertaining to the administration17of pain medication in nursing homes, including Schedule II18controlled substances; and19

WHEREAS, Physicians, nurses, and pharmacists are equally 20 qualified to manage a patient's pain in a hospital and a nursing 21 home; now therefore be it 22

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the 129th General Assembly 23 of the State of Ohio, urge the Congress of the United States and 24 the United States Drug Enforcement Administration to change 25 federal laws, regulations, and policies to allow patients to 26 receive any needed pain medication promptly when transferred to a 27 nursing home following a hospital stay for surgery or other 28 treatment; and be it further 29
