WHEREAS, Of the six research and test sites selected by the	18
Federal Aviation Administration, none are located in the	19
midwestern part of this country; rather, four are located in the	20
western part of this country and two are located in the eastern	21
part of this country; and	22
WHEREAS, The Federal Aviation Administration has yet to	23
disclose the specific findings that resulted from its	24
decision-making process on this matter, and, until it does so,	
legitimate questions linger as to how and why the Federal Aviation	
Administration arrived at its final decision; now therefore be it	27
RESOLVED, That the Federal Aviation Administration is	28
strongly urged to evaluate immediately all of the applications	
that were submitted for consideration but were not selected and to	
consider adding additional unmanned aircraft systems research and	
test sites that are qualified and bring value to the mission of	32
integrating unmanned aircraft systems into the national airspace;
