BILL SUMMARY

• Creates the "Nationwide Children's Hospital" license plate and requires the contributions that persons pay when obtaining the license plate to be paid to the organization "Nationwide Children's Hospital Foundation."

CONTENT AND OPERATION

"Nationwide Children's Hospital" license plate

Under the bill, the owner or lessee of any passenger car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other vehicle of a class approved by the Registrar of Motor Vehicles may apply to the Registrar for the registration of the vehicle and issuance of "Nationwide Children's Hospital" license plates. The application for "Nationwide Children's Hospital" license plates may be combined with a request for a special reserved license plate provided in current law. Upon receipt of the completed application and compliance with the bill's requirements, the Registrar is required to issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Nationwide Children's Hospital" license plates with a validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required by current law. In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily inscribed on license plates, "Nationwide Children's Hospital" license plates may be the Nationwide Children's Hospital and are approved by the Registrar. "Nationwide Children's Hospital" and are approved by the Registrar. "Nationwide Children's Hospital" plates must bear county identification stickers that identify the county of registration by name or number.¹

"Nationwide Children's Hospital" license plates and validation stickers are issued upon payment of the regular tax prescribed in current law, any applicable local motor vehicle tax, a Bureau of Motor Vehicles administrative fee of \$10, a contribution of \$25, and the applicant's compliance with all other applicable laws relating to motor vehicle registration. If the application for "Nationwide Children's Hospital" license plates is combined with a request for a special reserved license plate, the applicant must also pay the applicable additional special reserved license plate fee.²

The Registrar must transmit the \$25 contributions received under the bill to the Treasurer of State for deposit into the existing License Plate Contribution Fund. The bill then requires the Registrar to pay those contributions to the "Nationwide Children's Hospital Foundation."³

The bill requires the Registrar to deposit the \$10 BMV administrative fee, the purpose of which is to compensate the BMV for additional services required in issuing "Nationwide Children's Hospital" license plates, into the State Bureau of Motor Vehicles Fund.⁴
