BILL SUMMARY

- Designates the portion of United States Route 36, commencing at the intersection of that route and State Route 83 and proceeding in an easterly direction to the intersection of that United States route and State Route 93 within Coshocton County only, as the "Chief Petty Officer Raymond Border Memorial Highway."
- Declares that the designation is in addition to any other name prescribed in the Revised Code or otherwise.
- Authorizes the Director of Transportation to erect suitable markers along the highway indicating its name.¹

COMMENT

Navy Chief Petty Officer Raymond Border died on October 19, 2011, in Paktika province, Afghanistan, of wounds he suffered when he stepped out of a vehicle while assisting with a road inspection for a convoy and enemy forces detonated an improvised explosive device.
