## Fiscal Note & Local Impact Statement

**Bill:** S.B. 57 of the 128th G.A.

**Date:** May 5, 2009

**Status:** As Passed by the Senate

**Sponsor:** Sen. Gibbs

**Local Impact Statement Procedure Required:** No — No local cost

**Contents:** Permits a person who is 16 years old to donate blood with parental consent

### Detailed Fiscal Analysis

The bill permits any person 16 to 17 years of age to donate blood, with parental consent, in a voluntary blood program that is not operated for profit. Under continuing law, any person 17 years of age or older may donate blood in such a program without parental consent. The bill does not have a fiscal effect on the state or local governments.

According to the National Conference of State Legislatures, approximately 16 other states have laws that permit 16-year-olds to donate blood, usually with parental consent.
