**Contents**: Exempts a person who holds a current, valid driver's license from another state from passing the

regular examination in order to be issued a driver's license

### **State Fiscal Highlights**

No direct fiscal effect on the state.

### **Local Fiscal Highlights**

No direct fiscal effect on political subdivisions.

#### **Detailed Fiscal Analysis**

The bill provides that a person who holds a current, valid driver's license from another state be required to pass only a vision screening, rather than a vision screening and the written test, in order to be issued a driver's license in Ohio. This will not have a significant fiscal impact on the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV), because, under current law, a person who holds a current and valid driver's license from another state is already exempt from purchasing a temporary permit packet. The further exemption from the written test will not result in a loss of revenue to the BMV.
