Contents: Eliminates the declaration of material assistance/nonassistance

State Fiscal Highlights

• The repeal of the declaration of material assistance/nonassistance may decrease the administrative burden of the Department of Public Safety.

Local Fiscal Highlights

No direct fiscal effect on political subdivisions.

Detailed Fiscal Analysis

Under current law, the Director of Public Safety is required to develop a document to serve as a declaration of material assistance/nonassistance to a terrorist organization. The document has six questions and is designed so that an answer of "yes" to any of the questions means the responder has provided material assistance to a terrorist organization. Anyone who discloses the provision of material assistance to a terrorist organization is generally prohibited from: (1) obtaining certain state-issued licenses identified by the Director of Public Safety; (2) doing business with the state or a political subdivision; and (3) obtaining employment with the state, state instrumentalities, or political subdivisions. The bill repeals these provisions of current law. This repeal may decrease the administrative burden of the Department of Public Safety.
