**Contents**: Designates a portion of Interstate Route 480 in Cuyahoga County as the "Specialist Brandon U.

Sloan Memorial Highway"

### **State Fiscal Highlights**

• The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur costs of approximately \$350 to \$400 per sign, including materials and labor, to install appropriate markers along the designated section of Interstate Route 480 in Cuyahoga County.

### **Local Fiscal Highlights**

No direct fiscal effect on political subdivisions.

#### **Detailed Fiscal Analysis**

The bill designates a portion of Interstate Route 480 in Cuyahoga County as the "Specialist Brandon U. Sloan Memorial Highway." When a highway is designated as a memorial, the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) installs a memorial marker in a suitable spot, customarily a rest area, scenic overlook, recreational area, or along the designated highway itself. Two markers are usually installed, one in each direction at each location. According to ODOT, the cost of installing signs for memorial highways is approximately \$350 to \$400 per sign, including materials and labor. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are knocked down or damaged. Signs are usually in need of replacement every 12 to 15 years.
