Synopsis of Senate Committee Amendments*

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Sub. H.B. 468

130th General Assembly
(S. State Government Oversight and Reform)

Removes a provision that permits a person who purchases, takes possession of, and duly registers a motor vehicle in good faith to submit a claim to the purchaser's insurance company for the loss of the motor vehicle under certain circumstances.

Modifies the requirement that a specified disclosure be included on a salvage certificate of title, by requiring the clerk of the court of common pleas to include an emboldened notice, "SALVAGE MOTOR VEHICLE – PURSUANT TO R.C. 4738.01" instead of requiring the Registrar of Motor Vehicles to issue the certificate of title containing a specified disclosure notice.

Makes consistent throughout the bill that its provisions apply to the sale or purchase of salvage motor vehicle parts, in addition to salvage motor vehicles.

Specifies that the authorized purchaser limit of no more than five salvage motor vehicles in the current calendar year from any salvage motor vehicle auction or salvage motor vehicle pool, applies for auctions or pools located in Ohio.

Clarifies the bill's requirement that, when certain authorized purchasers submit documented proof of purchase eligibility to the salvage motor vehicle auction or salvage motor vehicle pool, the proof can be submitted in electronic or written format.

Requires every salvage motor vehicle auction and salvage motor vehicle pool to, for any sale of a salvage motor vehicle to a person residing in another country, stamp the words "FOR EXPORT ONLY" on the face of the vehicle title and in each unused reassignment space on the back of the title.

Requires every salvage motor vehicle auction and salvage motor vehicle pool to submit an electronic record of certain information collected on a monthly basis to a third party consolidator selected by the Registrar, instead of requiring the submission be directly to the Registrar.

Grants the Registrar 12 months, instead of 60 days, after the bill's effective date to have a statewide database for the collection of information to maintain an accurate record of all sales conducted by a salvage motor vehicle auction or salvage motor vehicle pool, and requires the Registrar to contract with an entity approved as a third party data consolidator to the National Motor Vehicle Title Information System for the development of the database instead of requiring the Registrar to develop the database.

Requires all expenses of the above contract to be paid from the State Bureau of Motor Vehicles Fund.

By January 1, 2018, requires the Common Sense Initiative Office to submit a report to the General Assembly making the following findings and recommendations:

--The cost-effectiveness of having the Registrar contract with a data consolidator to the National Motor Vehicle Title Information System;

--Whether or not to continue the reporting process as required under the bill.
